ADMISSION POLICY

The Copper Mountain College Vocational Nursing Program is approved by the California State Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians (<http://www.bvnpt.ca.gov>).

Note: The following application criteria and admission process applies to all applicants to the VN Program effective February 1, 2017.

REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICATION TO THE VN PROGRAM

- A. All prerequisite courses required for the VN Program must be completed within five (5) years of application for admission to the Program.*
- B. All prerequisite coursework must be completed with a grade of 'B' (3.0 grade point average [GPA]) or better. All college level coursework must be completed with a cumulative GPA 2.75 or higher. All college level attempts at courses taken at any accredited school will be used to calculate the GPA, including those with a grade of I, W, D and/or F.
- C. Proof of high school graduation or GED which is demonstrated by providing an official copy of one (1) of the following: An official high school transcript **or** official transcript demonstrating evidence of a passing score on the California High School Proficiency Examinations **or** an official GED transcript. Foreign high school diplomas or college degrees must be evaluated and determined to be equivalent by an international evaluation service approved by Copper Mountain College (CMC). Schedule an appointment with a CMC counselor for details regarding the foreign transcript evaluation process.
- D. Official transcripts must be submitted for ALL college coursework attempted or completed at any college and must be presented at the time of application to the VN Program. It is the applicant's responsibility to provide official transcripts and any requested evidence of meeting all admission criteria.

Foreign transcripts must be evaluated by a Foreign Transcript Evaluator approved by CMC. An appointment must be made with a CMC counselor and documented evidence of their clearance must be submitted with the application.

- E. English and Math competency are required. Applicants must complete the assessment test (Accuplacer) administered by CMC (register for this exam in the Office of Student Services). If the English score is below 99, English 51 must be completed and/or if the mathematics score is below 65, Math 57 must be completed PRIOR to application to the Program.

ADMISSION SELECTION PROCESS

The application and selection process is designed to offer the highest degree possible of equity in consideration of all qualified applicants. Every attempt is made to avoid any possibility of unreasonable bias in the selection process. The Program Coordinator has ultimate decision-making authority regarding Program admissions.

- A. Applications for admission are accepted every year beginning 9:00 am on February 1 (or the first workday following that date if February 1 falls on a weekend or holiday) and ending on February 28 at 4:00 pm (or at 4:00 pm on the last workday preceding that date if February 28 falls on a weekend or holiday).

Applications must be submitted in a sealed manila envelope with the applicant's first and last name, the date of submission and "VN Program Application" on the outside of the envelope. Applications must be received by the HSNP office Monday through Friday from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm during the application period. The HSNP office is not responsible for applications submitted via the US Postal Service or other carrier and not received by the HSNP office during the application period.

Only complete applications will be accepted for consideration. Incomplete or illegible applications will be rejected and destroyed.

- B. After the application period has ended, each application will be screened for evidence of completion of all prerequisite coursework. All prerequisite courses required for the VN Program must be completed with a grade of 'B' or better within five (5) years of application for admission to the Program.

- C. Applicants who are considered for conditional admission are notified via e-mail. Failure to respond by the specified deadline results in removal of the applicant for consideration and the next qualified applicant will be given the opportunity of conditional admission.

If there is an insufficient number of qualified applicants who meet ALL admission criteria, the VN Program Admission Committee may select applicants based upon coursework in progress and/or any coursework with a 'C' to fill remaining seats.

- D. Applicants who have been dismissed from any Allied Health/Health Sciences/Nursing Program at any school for the following reasons may be ineligible for admission to the CMC VN Program:

- Academic and/or clinical failure (failure = D or F grade)
- Unsafe clinical performance
- Acts of dishonesty or unethical behavior
- Violation of program professional conduct standards.

Such applicants wishing to be considered for admission must submit a letter from the previous program director explaining the circumstances of the dismissal including whether the applicant would be eligible for readmission to that program. The applicant must also undergo an interview with the CMC VN Program Director and at least one Program faculty member.

- E. The VN Program requires a criminal background check and 10 panel drug screen. Applicants who have a felony on their background check and/or fail the drug screen are ineligible for admission to the Program. Applicants who have a misdemeanor on their background check may be ineligible for admission to the Program.

- F. Applicants chosen for admission to the Program may be required to achieve a passing score of 75% on a basic mathematics examination to be administered on orientation day. If an applicant fails to achieve the required score, the applicant may be removed from consideration for admission.

TRANSFER CREDIT

A. Previous Education

1. Transfer credit will be given for related previous education completed within the last last five (5) years if it is deemed equivalent after review of all transcripts and related related course information. This may include:
 - Accredited Vocational or Practical Nursing courses
 - Accredited Registered Nursing courses
 - Accredited Psychiatric Technician courses
 - Armed services nursing courses
 - California Nurse Assistant courses
 - Other courses the Program Coordinator determines are equivalent to prerequisite or VN Program courses
2. Applicants must meet admission criteria and be accepted into the Vocational Nursing Program.
3. Applicant must submit transcripts, syllabi and COR (Course Outline of Record) from satisfactorily completed coursework. All documents should be submitted a minimum of two (2) weeks prior to the commencement of the term.
4. Evaluation committee (VN Program Coordinator, VN or Health Sciences faculty, transcript evaluator) will determine appropriate level of placement for applicant.
5. Applicant will be advised of committee decision within two (2) business days after the meeting.

B. Experience

1. Applicants must meet admission criteria and be accepted into the Vocational Nursing Program.
2. Documentation of experience to be submitted include:
 - Job description
 - Letter from supervisor addressing proficiency of all points in the job description. The letter should include evaluation of clinical skills by a licensed healthcare provider (LVN, RN, NP, PA, MD, DO or Paramedic)
 - All documentation should be submitted a minimum of two (2) weeks before commencement of the term
 - Syllabi, text and review information for courses applicant wishes to challenge will be provided
3. Competency testing will be scheduled. The testing will include:
 - Written component - based on objectives of the course being challenged

- Skills demonstration - based on the expected skills competency of the course /level being challenged
 - Clinical Scenario - Applicant to develop a concept map or care plan commensurate with the course level being challenged
4. Program faculty will grade written component and evaluate the skill practicum. The Applicant must score a minimum of 80% on the written and the skills portion to qualify for credit.
