M	IP	N	Completion and certification of CSU will permit a student to transfer from Copper Mountain College to a campus in CSU system without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division general education courses. <b>All courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better.</b> <b>CERTIFICATION:</b> GE Certification means that CMC has verified that a student has completed lower-division requirements for the CSU system. Certification is important, without certification students will be held to general education requirements specific to the CSU campus to which they transfer. GE certification is not required for transfer.
