INTERSEGMENTAL GENERAL EDUCATION TRANSFER CURRICULUM (IGETC)

M	IP	N	Completion and certification of IGETC will permit a student to transfer from Copper Mountain College to a campus in the UC or CSU system without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division general education courses. <b>All courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better.</b> <b>CERTIFICATION:</b> Current IGETC standards allow for full or partial certification. Partial certification is defined as completing all but two courses from any area except those listed in Areas 1 and 2. In the final term before transfer students should request IGETC certification with Admissions & Records when requesting their final transcripts to be sent to the UC or CSU campus of their choice. <b>CAUTION: IGETC may not be the best option for transfer, particularly for majors such as Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Computer Science, Engineering, and Math. Consult with a counselor for more details.</b> <b>LEGEND:</b> <i>Courses without prerequisites are italicized</i> *Courses that appear in multiple areas below, can only be counted in one area. +Transfer credit may be limited by UC, CSU or both.
